Supporting the empowerment of young people through high-quality, innovative and recognised socio-educational activities.

European Youth Guarantee

The Youth Guarantee, created in 2013, helps young people find a job, further training, apprenticeship, or traineeship within four months of unemployment or leaving formal education.

Youth and the media

The European law on audiovisual media services guarantees the protection of minors from content likely to harm them, whether this content is offered by traditional broadcasters or on-demand services.
