Made of **12 gold stars** against a **royal blue backdrop**. It was officially adopted by EU leaders in **1985**!

Beethoven's melody "**Ode to Joy**" without any lyrics is used as the anthem of the EU.

The music was **composed in 1823** and **made the official anthem in 1985.**



Europe Day

Held every year on **9th May**, which is the anniversary of the **Schuman declaration**, Europe Day is a celebration of the **peace**, **prosperity** and **unity** in the EU.

Did you know?

The Euro isn't an official symbol because it is not used by all 27 Member States





On 9th May 1950, the French foreign minister Robert Schuman suggested creating an institution (organisation) of multiple European countries to share their resources and make trade easier. This created the European Coal and Steel Community (ECSC) which was the first step towards the EU we know today.

The motto

The phrase "United in diversity" was officially adopted in 2000. It represents the various cultures and identities across Europe, as well as unity between them to create peace and prosperity.
