## What we see today :



Gross domestic product down by 0.3% in 2022.



Inflation exceeded 10%, triggering a serious crisis and historic strikes.



Brexit is costing the UK economy £100 billion a year, with effects ranging from business investment to their ability to hire workers.



Illegal immigration reached record levels in 2022, just as the UK's exit from the EU was supposed to enable it to regain control of its borders.

Between **55% and 60%** of British people now regret having left Europe. Young people are even more likely to regret leaving.
