EU countries **have to be representative democracies** to be in the club with free and fair elections.

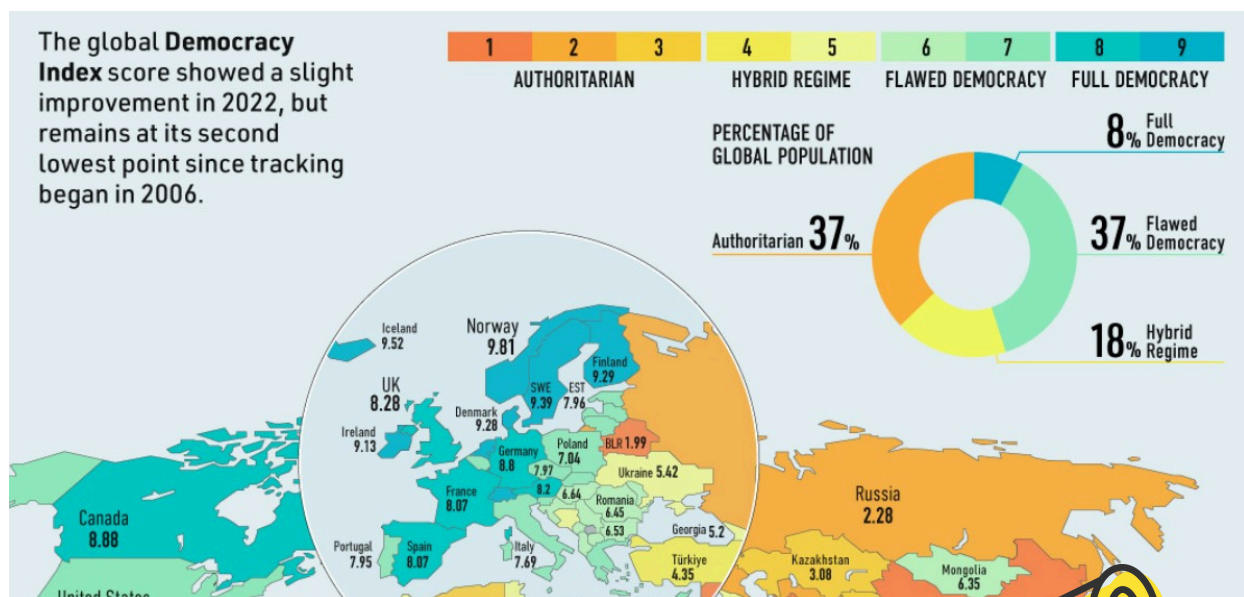
Being a European citizen gives **political rights and obligations**.



Democracy gives political and social rights

- All EU citizens have the **right to stand** in elections to the European Parliament
- All EU citizens have the **right to vote** in the European elections in their country of residence in the EU.
- **Petition the European Parliament**
- Launch a **European Citizen Initiative**
- **Non-discrimination** according to nationality
- **Move and reside freely** across the EU

Democratic backsliding in the EU

Several EU countries have engaged in democratic backsliding for years. It involves a **state-led elimination of the political institutions sustaining an existing democracy**.

It depends on the national government in power. Over the last decade, Hungary, Poland, Croatia, Czech Republic, Greece have all been criticised for undermining democratic values



The European Union is often criticized for its **democratic deficit**.
