Food waste targets: 10% cut in manufacturing, 30% cut in retail/restaurants/households by 2030.

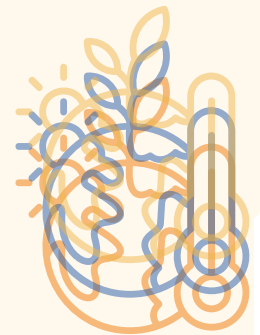
Textile waste rules: Producers must fund collection & recycling (Extended Producer Responsibility).
